Nouns: We need to know gender and number, in (-a person, place, or thing) order to conjugate correctly.

• Person: we know gender

• Place or thing } Know gender based on the ending

- ends in -a = feminine

- ends in -o = masculine

ex.: The book / My friend Alicia
el libro / Mi amiga Alicia

Adjectives: describe the noun

- Ugly friend

(changed)

In English, the adjectives doesn't get modified.

but in Spanish, it changes according to gender and number

ex. (1) ugly friend (m) / My favourite colors are ...

pastors → noun) adj.

change according to gender

change according to number

Verbs: Show actions

- in Spanish there are 6 different forms of conjugating (but we only use 5 in Acosta's class)

- Verbs get conjugated according to the subject pronouns

<u>yo</u>	-o	er/ir
<u>Tu</u>	-as	-es

el, ella, ud. - a - e

Nosotros -amos -emos/imos

Ellos, ellas, uds. -an -en

• Nouns, Adj, Verbs = all have to agree in gender & number.

Maria y Juan (ellos)
subject

Comer (comen)
verb

bueno
adj.

Tacos y burrito (tacos y burritos)
obj. nouns

Ellos comen tacos y burritos buenos.
